The UNESCO Secretariat (SHS) will present some **results of the analysis of the country reports**, how these results support the consultation process and what specific international activities they potentially contribute to. The Secretariat will also report on how the monitoring of the recommendation and the **development of the Assessment Tool on the freedom and safety of scientists** can be mutually beneficial.
